## FUNDING FOR SCHOLARSHIPS/GRANTS

Again this year MCJA donated funds to the Maryland Correctional Administrators Association (MCAA) Scholarship Fund. This is the second year in a row that MCJA has supported this worthwhile project. The MCAA Scholarship Foundation was established by the Association in 2001.

Over the past 8 years, more than \$90,000 in college and professional development scholarships have been awarded to deserving corrections professionals and their dependents throughout the State of

Maryland. Funds for scholarships are derived from vendor support, donations like MCJA's and special events such as the annual golf tournament.

## The Professional Development Grant

is to be used for programs such as training programs and professional seminars. This year's winner is Baltimore County Department of Corrections and the award will be used to allow the Department's employees to attend leadership and management training.

The Association established the Memorial College Scholarship Program in an effort to encourage and assist college level students in pursuing a career in the

field of Corrections or closely related Criminal Justice Professions. This year 11 scholarships were awarded. 4 scholarships were awarded to employees of facilities throughout the State and 7 scholarships were awarded to dependents of employees. Congratulations to all of the winners

# By-Laws Committee



## Maryland Criminal Justice Association Constitution and By-Laws

The Maryland Criminal Justice Association (MCJA) is in the process of reviewing and amending our Constitution and By-Laws. In accordance with our existing MCJA Constitution and By-Laws:

“This Constitution and By-Laws may be amended by the action of the membership. An amendment may be suggested by the recommendation of the MCJA Board or by petition to the President signed by twenty-five (25) members in good

standing of the MCJA.”

“Notice containing the full text of any proposed amendment shall be given to the membership, in writing, at least 15 days and not more than 45 days prior to the annual or spring conferences.”

“The proposed amendment shall be presented, by written ballot, to the membership at the annual or spring conferences, and upon two-thirds affirmative vote of those voting, the amendment shall be approved and effective.”

Please make certain that you are included in the process by casting your vote at

our upcoming conference. This exciting event will be held at the Princess Royale Hotel in Ocean City, Maryland from September 27 through September 29, 2009.

Suzy’s career spans over 25 years in the field of Corrections. She graduated from Indiana University with a Bachelor’s degree in Forensic studies and a minor in Psychology. Her first professional job was working as a Probation Officer in Galveston, Texas in the mid 1980’s. Suzy was hired by the Montgomery County Depart-
